

# **Dress Codes**

Our intent is to help our students develop a sense of good judgement about clothing, making choices that are consistent with Quaker principles of modesty and simplicity.

All students are expected to dress tidily, wearing clothing that is clean and in good condition. The code aims to encourage appropriate clothing for the School work place, to increasingly allow individual expression as a student progresses through the School and to promote awareness of our responsibility to the School community.

## Schoolrooms (Years 7, 8 and 9)

### **General Regulations**

- Jewellery should be minimal and appropriate to the workplace. Earrings may only be sleepers or studs.
- No make-up or nail varnish
- Hair colouring should be a natural shade
- No military style clothing, bags or backpacks
- Hats and hoods should not be worn inside

#### **Specific Regulations**

- Uniform kilt \* or traditional plain black trousers not skin tight or denim (trousers are available from Schoolblazer or from the school range of a high street store)
- Uniform crested Cambridge blue polo shirt \*
- Uniform navy crested V-neck jumper with Cambridge blue trim \*
- Plain dark/white socks or navy/black tights (no footless tights)
- Sensible black leather shoes. No trainers or trainer/canvas style shoes, sandals or boots

## Seniors (Years 10 and 11)

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All students are expected to dress tidily, wearing clothing that is clean and in good condition. The code aims to encourage appropriate clothing for the School work-place, to

increasingly allow individual expression as a student progresses through the School and to promote awareness of our responsibility to the School community.

#### **General Regulations**

- Make-up, natural coloured hair dye and jewellery should be minimal and appropriate to the workplace.
- Blue denim and tracksuit trousers should not be worn
- No military style clothing, bags or backpacks
- Clothing should be in good condition (not ripped or frayed)
- Hats and hoods should not be worn inside

### Specific Regulations

- Plain trousers/skirt (reasonable length = just above the knee.) Leggings are allowed under skirts.
- Plain jumper/sweatshirt or hoodie (without large or offensive logos)
- Plain dark tights
- A buttoned up shirt/blouse or a polo shirt (no crop tops, t-shirts or vest tops)
- Sensible shoes, boots or trainers

## College (Years 12 and 13)

Our intent is to help our students develop a sense of good judgement about clothing, making choices that are consistent with Quaker principles of modesty and simplicity.

All students are expected to dress tidily, wearing clothing that is clean and in good condition. The code aims to encourage appropriate clothing for the School work-place, to increasingly allow individual expression as a student progresses through the School and to promote awareness of our responsibility to the School community.

### **General Regulations**

- Make-up, natural coloured hair dye and jewellery should be minimal and appropriate to the workplace
- No military style clothing, bags or backpacks
- No offensive logos, images or slogans
- Piercings (other than earrings) are not permitted
- All clothing should be modest and underwear should not be visible
- Clothing should be in good condition (not ripped or frayed)
- Hats and hoods should not be worn inside

#### **Specific Regulations**

- Low-slung jeans are not appropriate
- No leggings without a skirt or long top
- No mini-skirts or very short dresses but all should be of a suitably modest length
- No crop tops, low-cut or strap tops
- High or sharp-heeled shoes are not permitted
- Appropriate footwear for the workplace (no flip flops or slippers)
- Shorts which reach at least halfway to the knee are acceptable but no sports' shorts
