

## A LEVEL LATIN

The course is divided into language and literature components culminating in four written examinations at the end of College 2 as follows:

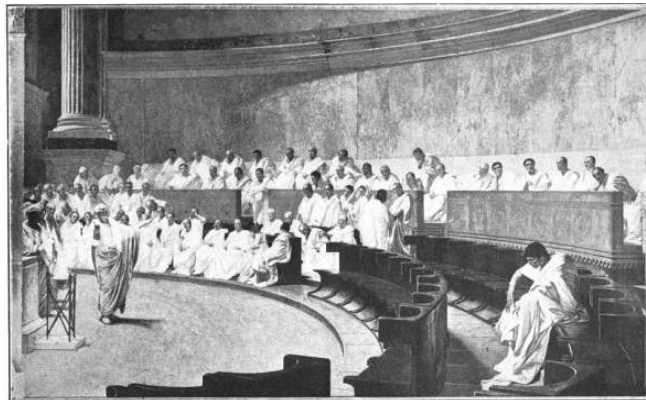
### Language (50% of the A level):

- Unseen translation of a passage of prose into English and a passage of verse into English.
- Either Comprehension: students will complete a short translation, answer comprehension questions and grammar questions  
or Prose Composition: students will translate a passage of English, of at least 100 words, into Latin.

Students build on their knowledge of vocabulary and linguistic structures following on from GCSE.

### Literature (50% of the A level):

- Prose Literature: students will answer translation, comprehension and an analysis question on two set texts studied eg. Tacitus Annals, Cicero Pro Milone or Seneca's letters, and an essay question on one of these texts and the additional reading they have done in English.
- Verse Literature: students will answer translation, comprehension and an analysis question on two set texts studied eg. Virgil Aeneid Book 11 or selections from Ovid's Amores or Heroides, and an essay question on one of these texts and the additional reading they have done in English.
